Finding our Way Back from the Drift

1. Find a point of reference. For believers, this is the Word of God.
2. Begin to paddle in the right direction. The drift may have been unintentional, but making your way back to Jesus starts with a decision to move towards Him. A decision without action is just a dream.
3. Keep going. It's ok to rest, but don't give up. It took time to drift away, it will take time to get back to where you want to be.
4. Ask others for help if needed. Sometimes, we need others to help pull us in the right direction or to simply encourage us. There is no shame in asking for help!
5. Keep your eye on the goal. As you get closer and closer, excitement and faith will build in your life.

Jesus, I need you. I know that I am not as close to You as I could be. I have drifted. Forgive me and wash me in Your blood. Help me to make a decision to get closer to you. Help me recognize the currents that take me away from you and into danger. Give me the strength to keep going in my faith and not give up. Lead me into the still waters and restore my soul. In the mighty and powerful name of Jesus, Amen.
